# Let's not forget EASTER.

As **Romans 6:4** beautifully puts it, "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."

#### Easter signifies hope.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the ultimate symbol of hope for humanity. It's a reminder that no matter how dark our circumstances may seem, there is always hope in Christ.

In **1 Peter 1:3**, it says, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

### Easter is a celebration of victory over death.

Jesus' resurrection conquered death once and for all, offering us the promise of eternal life with Him. This victory empowers us to live boldly and fearlessly, knowing that death has no hold on us.

As 1 Corinthians 15:55-57 proclaims, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."
