In **Romans 14:1,** Paul writes, "Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarrelling over disputable matters." Just as in our diverse personal and business viewpoints, we encounter individuals with varying perspectives, backgrounds, and approaches.

Then, in **Romans 14:3**, Paul reminds us, "The one who eats everything must not treat with contempt the one who does not, and the one who does not eat everything must not judge the one who does, for God has accepted them." We are called to extend this same grace to our peers, offering support and encouragement even when we don't see eye to eye. Let's continue to commit to explore practical ways we can demonstrate Christ-like love and acceptance in our interactions when we meet together.
